



Overview: A classic European-style inn with a contemporary spin, this historic Inn, built in 1874, underwent a \$2 million renovation and reopened in June 2007. The Camden Harbour Inn is an exquisite boutique hotel with world-class service. The 18 guestrooms – each with a distinct style and dazzling view – offer every modern convenience as well as uber-luxe bathrooms, robes and fine linens. Some of the rooms feature working fireplaces, balconies or private decks. Dutch Owners Raymond Brunyanski and Oscar Verest have fused their appreciation for high style and global design with a chic urban sensibility, while simultaneously retaining the integrity and grace of this historically significant setting.

Natalie’s, the Camden Harbour Inn’s signature restaurant, has been called the finest gourmet eatery in Maine, offering sophisticated décor, impeccable service and gourmet Modern French dining, without the pressure of formal attire.

Location: Camden Harbour Inn in Camden, Maine sits atop a stunning hillside offering views of the picturesque Camden Harbour, Mount Battie and Penobscot Bay. The Inn is less than a five-minute walk to the picturesque village of Camden, and a short drive to Rockport and Lincolnville, two other timeless communities in Midcoast Maine.

History: The Inn was built as a lodging establishment in 1874, when summer guests came to the Maine coast by steamship to enjoy the invigorating sea air and escape the city heat. Over the years, many prominent and famous people have stayed at the inn. Walt Disney even selected it to be his very own “fairytale castle” when he visited Camden.

Design: The stunning interiors of Camden Harbour Inn and Natalie’s Restaurant are the result of a collaborative effort between top European designer Mascha Brunia and the Inn’s co-owner Raymond Brunyanski.

Natalie’s has the look and feel of the elegant Parisian eateries of the early 1900s sparked with contemporary casual accents. With a bar designed from doors salvaged from a French convent, Natalie’s Bar is a chic, intimate spot for an after-work cocktail or casual meal.

Accommodations:

The Camden Harbour Inn has fourteen luxurious guest rooms, three junior suites, and one grand suite, each enhanced by million-dollar water views and modern European flair. The Inn's Dutch owners have woven in a touch of their homeland's history by naming the rooms after famous Asian, Caribbean, African and American ports-of-call where, during the 1600 and 1700s, the Dutch East India Company conducted its famous spice trade.

All of the rooms in this boutique hotel are designed with a European sensibility, blending traditional comforts and trendy accents. Modern design elements surround plush king-size featherbeds and flat-screen TVs with DVD players. The majority of the furniture throughout the Inn and guestrooms is imported from Europe, and the sleek lines perfectly complement the building's period architectural details.

Inn guests enjoy a daily complimentary gourmet breakfast featuring freshly baked housemade specialties prepared by the pastry chef. Guests are also offered an a la carte selection of hot entrees including lobster eggs Benedict and Thai Green Curry omelet. Camden Harbour Inn's breakfast always includes a glass of Prosecco or Mimosa. Throughout the day, complimentary coffee, tea, and snacks are available in the Princess Juliana Lounge.

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Dining: **Natalie's**, the Inn's award-winning restaurant, has been called the finest gourmet eatery in Maine and offers fine dining in a warm atmosphere of light-hearted sophistication set against unparalleled harbor and bay views. The Restaurant's Modern French menu marries imaginative yet classic French cuisine with the freshest local ingredients, and offers 200 specialty wines from its exceptional wine cellar. Everything is made from scratch in-house, and the menu changes seasonally. Recently restyled by top European designer Mascha Brunia, the entire restaurant has the look and feel of elegant Parisian eateries of the early 1900s sparked with contemporary casual accents. Dining is also offered on the wrap-around porch, which is heated during the crisp spring and autumn evenings.

Natalie's Bar is an intimate spot for an after-work cocktail or a casual meal and features a menu worthy of a second meal at the Inn. Known for chic ambience and inventive cocktails like the signature and award-winning "Victoria's Secret" martini, Natalie's Bar attracts a worldly circle of patrons.

In-room dining from the Natalie's restaurant menu is available in the morning between 7:30 and 9:30 a.m. and in the evening between 5:30 and 9:30 p.m. Reservations can be made through the Inn directly or via opentable.com.

Events: The Camden Harbour Inn is an exceptional venue for intimate events such as weddings, private parties, and small conferences or seminars. Its hilltop setting with spectacular ocean and mountain views, beautifully appointed common rooms, stunning outdoor patios and decks, and award-winning fine dining restaurant combine to create a superlative experience for truly memorable events. All eighteen guest rooms and suites may also be reserved for the exclusive use of event guests.

Activities: Camden and the surrounding villages are brimming with adventures and culture and shopping choices, including:

- **Boating** – Coastal scenic cruises from Camden or Rockport Harbor including sightseeing boats, windjammer sails, and charters.
- **Biking, Hiking, and Kayaking** – Experience Camden from a new point of view with two wheels, two feet, or a paddle.
- **Fishing** – All types are available nearby from fly-fishing to deep-sea charters.
- **Museums** – Some of the Camden area's most popular museums include:
 - **Conway Homestead-Cramer Museum** – A 16th-century homestead.
 - **Farnsworth Art Museum and Wyeth Center** – Celebrating *Maine's Role in American Art*, the Farnsworth offers a nationally recognized collection of works from many of America's greatest artists. The Wyeth Center is one of only two centers in the country dedicated to the three generations of the Maine-based Wyeths: N.C., Andrew, and James Wyeth.
 - **Maine Lighthouse Museum** – Significant collection of lighthouse lenses and other artifacts.
 - **Owls Head Transportation Museum** – Collections of antique automobiles, motorcycles and airplanes, all in operational condition.
 - **Montpelier** – Replica of the 19-room mansion built by Major General Henry Knox, George Washington's Secretary of War, with original furnishings.
 - **Penobscot Marine Museum** – Artifacts from 18th- and 19th-century seafaring and shipbuilding.

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Access: *By car:*

- Approximately 7 hours from New York City and 3 ½ hours from Boston.

By air:

- Knox County Airport: 12 miles from Camden; car rentals are available at the airport or transfers can be arranged by the Inn.
- Bangor International Airport: 1½ hour drive
- Portland International Airport: 2 hour drive
